Description: This presentation introduces fiber-reinforced, inorganic, composite panels as

noncombustible structural cementitious floor, roof and wall sheathing panels. The sheathing panels described in this presentation are intended to be installed over cold-formed steel framing and used as a structural sub-floor for noncombustible floor/ceiling assemblies. When installed as roof sheathing it provides a structural substrate for a multitude of roof finishes, ranging from low-slope, direct- and mechanically applied systems. In wall systems the sheathing provides both a

structural, fire-resistant and a cavity wall system.
